


What is Peace?





4. Soon, thousands and thousands of books were printed, put in boxes, and sent to children at their schools.




5. At first, the children who got the books were doubtful. They didn't think anything would work. "Nothing children do can make a difference at our school."








7. A teacher and a counselor helped that group of children in their classroom. Together, they learned ways to build peace.







13. Other children and grown-ups also heard about PeaceBuilders from the news stories. They wanted their sites, their homes, and their cities to have PeaceBuilders, too.
